John G. Waite Associates, Architects (JGWA) is returning to the old Binghamton Inebriate Asylum to complete the next phase of the “Castle on the Hill” project which will transform the abandoned National Historic Landmark into a new medical educational facility for SUNY Upstate Medical University. The interior and exterior restoration will include the creation of a much needed community medical clinic as well as classroom and meeting spaces. JGWA previously prepared a feasibility study in 2008 which will guide the building’s future restoration. The project will be a national model for the preservation and reuse of a nineteenth-century asylum.

The University of Virginia has selected JGWA to complete the interior and exterior restoration of Thomas Jefferson’s Rotunda. In 2008 JGWA completed a Historic Structure Report for The Rotunda. The report was part of a comprehensive evaluation of the original Jefferson buildings that began with the preparation of a historic structure report for Pavilion I in 1988 and continued with reports for five additional Pavilions including: Varsity Hall (1857-58), one of the earliest surviving college infirmaries in the United States; and the McKim, Mead, and White-designed classroom buildings, Cocke and Rouss Halls. The firm is also currently restoring The Rotunda’s roof under its existing Historic Preservation Requirements contract.

The JGWA New York City Office is moving forward from the design phase into the construction phase at Sagamore Hill National Historic Site, Theodore Roosevelt’s home in Oyster Bay, NY. Sagamore Hill will undergo a complete restoration along with infrastructure upgrades, renewed mechanical systems, and new lighting, and landscape drainage work.

John G. Waite Associates, Architects, welcomes Intern Architect David Weirick to the firm.

David is currently assisting with a number of projects, including the development of construction drawings for the exterior restoration of The Rotunda at the University of Virginia; conditions assessments and developing schematic design drawings for the restoration of the Norfolk Music Shed; and creating a model of the Church of All Saints, Ashmont to test massing and elevation characteristics of a new addition.

David is a 2012 graduate of Clemson University/College of Charleston with a Master of Science in Historic Preservation. He received a Bachelor of Science in Architecture at the University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee in 2010.
