Working with the National Park Service, **John G. Waite Associates, Architects** has completed the relocation and restoration of **Hamilton Grange National Monument** in New York City, NY. The Grange was completed in 1802 to the designs of John McComb Jr. as the country home of Alexander Hamilton. Hamilton was one of America's greatest founding fathers, who also served as the first United States Secretary of the Treasury during his legal and political career.

To ensure the successful relocation and preservation of The Grange, **JGWA** supervised building probes and updated the Historic Structure Report prior to the move of the house to St. Nicholas Park in Harlem. **JGWA** prepared a complex set of phased construction documents to guide the relocation as well as the exterior and interior restoration of the house. The firm developed an exhibit design and historic furnishings recommendations to allow a period-appropriate interpretation of The Grange, which is again open to the public.
